Catholic Tidbits

What do Archbishop Listecki, our pastor, Fr. Aaron Esch, our former associate pastor, Fr. Kevin Barnekow, and parishioner Denna Flemming, all have in common? They are all members of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. After the First Crusade's leader, Godfrey de Bouillon, liberated Jerusalem in 1099, five military orders were founded to protect the new Kingdom of Jerusalem; the Knights Hospitaller, the Knights of the Hospital of Saint Mary of Jerusalem (Teutonic Knights). The Knights Templar was suppressed in 1312, and the Knights of Saint Lazarus no longer is recognized. The Teutonic Knights is now known as the German Order and exists solely as a religious order. The Knights Hospitaller (as the Sovereign Military Order of Malta) and the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre (as the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre) survive to this day as orders of knighthood.

Today, there are about 30,000 knights and ladies worldwide in the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre. The Order is the only lay institution of the Vatican State, whose mission is to provide for the needs to the Latin Patriachate of Jerusalem and to support the Christian presence in the Holy Land. In addition to supporting Christians in the Holy Land through prayers and financial contributions to mission such as Christian schools and hospitals, knights and ladies pledge to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land at least once during their lifetimes in order to not only see the Holy Sites, but also to meet the Christians in the Holy Land whom they support. The Christians of the Holy Land are known as Living Stones as they are the descendants of the first followers of Christ. Many people do not realize that since World War II ended, the population of Christians in the Holy Land has dwindled, primarily due to political reasons from 20% of the population to less than 2%.
