In honor of Polanki's 65th Anniversary this year!



Did you know...

Polanki's first fundraising effort was an Easter Tea, featuring homemade pastries and traditional Polish decorations. Financed with borrowed money, it was a resounding success. The second major event of Polanki's inaugural year involved recreating a traditional St. John's Eve celebration on the lagoon in Mitchell Park, which Polanki organized with the cooperation of several other Polish organizations. Attending by over 6,000 persons, this festive event included an orchestra concert, a performance by the Mazur Polish dancers, and the floating of floral wreaths with lighted candles. Polanki launched the wreaths from boats decorated with Christmas tree lights, ingeniously – if not exactly traditional –powered by car batteries. The third major event of Polanki's first year was the club's participation in a community effort to showcase Milwaukee's ethnic heritage- Holiday Folk Fair. Although the Easter Teas came to an end several years later, when expenses outpaced revenues, Polanki's participation in Folk Fair has continued to be a major focus. In addition to raising funds through our sales booth, and formerly our food booth, we have produced approximately sixty cultural exhibits, and earned awards for a number of them. Since 1982, Polanki has added Polish Fest – the Milwaukee area's premier Polish event – to its calendar. AT this outdoor celebration of Polish entertainment, food, and culture, Polanki operates a profitable sales booth, coordinates the Cultural Area, and often participates in other capacities.



Busia: Seasons on the Farm with my Polish Grandmother is described as a "charming life of a young boy living on a farm in rural Michigan in the early 1950's at a time when telephones and televisions have not entered their lives. Instead, they cook and garden and work together to keep the stoves supplied with wood and coal and the cupboards filled with homemade goodies. They prepare for holidays while they fear that the landlord will ask them to move and give up the farm and all the seasonal delights it holds—in the attic, the barn, and down the lane to the creek. A simple and poignant tale of the bonds between an only child and his loving "Busia", his Polish grandmother." Author, Leonard Kniffel who is a resident of Chicago will present this book at the Polanki General Membership meeting on May 11th 2018.Mr. Kniffel will bring books for sale.
