



She was a lifetime member of Polanki – the Polish Women's Cultural Club, where she actively participated and served for 50 years.

Numerous Polanki members (together with their family and friends) contributed to make Polanki events successful—from pierogi dinners, to soup festivals, to the 65th Polanki Anniversary Dinner, to the Cultural Village at Polish Fest, to the sales booth at Polish Fest, to the cultural exhibit and sales booth at Holiday Folk Fair, to the Awards Tea, to the Spring and Holiday bazaars, and to the Christmas Party—thank you to everyone who chaired and/or participated in these signature Polanki events! Other opportunities came to Polanki through members, such as the Portage County Cultural Fest, A Day in Poland at Cudahy Library, Multicultural Day at Lane Intermediate School, Culture Day at Manpower, and Boston Store Community Days—to name a few—and members stepped up to make these events memorable for all participants. It was heartwarming for me to see members working together for Polanki's benefit.

My life goal—to make things better than how I have found them—was transferred to my goal as Polanki's President. To that end, <u>WE</u> (Board members and advisors) accomplished much during the past two years. Here are some highlights:

- Created a Grant Request Form to be completed by organizations and individuals who seek monies from Polanki
- Utilized press releases and social media to announce Polanki's events
- Drafted and approved an Investment Policy and retained MPC Advisors, LLC to invest certain Polanki funds
- Instituted separation of duties among directors to comply with Polanki's bylaws and business internal control procedures
- Established the requirement that a balance sheet (listing Polanki's assets and liabilities) and income statement (listing profits and losses) be prepared quarterly for Polanki (a necessity which was never before required)

- Established a central depository for Polanki's forms and records (past and present) using FirmEx (a data site used for business projects)
- Created more opportunities for different members to be involved in projects.

It was my pleasure to make personal contributions to Polanki as well. The annual subscription to Sign-Up Genius permits both active and sustaining members to sign up to volunteer at Polanki events. A new projector screen resides at Villa St. Francis. My employer agreed to host the FirmEx data site. My employer also kindly allowed me to make copies of the Board agenda and document packets for distribution at each Board meeting (essential to provide the same information to all Board members). And, as a testament to my life goal to continual improvement—a covered tote with a handle to transport the gavel, microphone and microphone cord to the membership meetings.

Thank you again for the opportunity to lead Polanki. Until we are able to meet again in person, I wish all Polanki members the best.

Free masks for Polanki members and their families from Margie Hess, Polanki Sustaining Member

So far in these pandemic times, Margie Hess has made over 650 masks for family, friends and friends of friends! Recently, she made masks for Ewa Barczyk, who suggested that Polanki members and their families would benefit from having masks. The masks will be free to those who need them.

If you are interested in having masks made from any of your Polish scarves or shawls, a 29 inch square scarf can create 12 mask fronts. A 44 square inch shawl can create 32 masks. Margie also can make masks similar to those in the photo.

If you donate a Polish scarf or shawl, Margie will make you 4 masks per person in your household (with Polish fabrics or other fabrics suited to your family's needs, including fabrics suited for males to wear) and then donate the remainder to other Polanki members in need. Margie will accept any new rayon material or quilting cotton to make more masks for Polanki members' families.

The masks were created from patterns offered by Deaconess Hospital. They can be made with elastic or with soft jersey ties. The masks are intended to be worn during one outing, then put into the washer and dryer after use. You can send or drop off your Polish scarves or shawls or other new fabric to:

Completed masks can be picked up at Margie's home. Camille Shaw has also volunteered to collect your fabric donations or deliver masks to you. Completed masks can also be sent to your location. If you do not need masks but would like to make a donation of new percale sheet sets, 100% cotton quilting fabric or money to cover postage, that too will be kindly accepted and put to good use for people needing masks.
