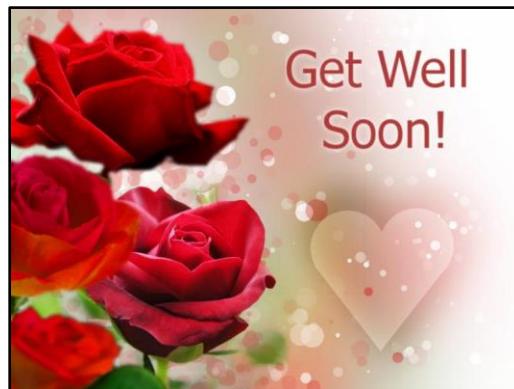

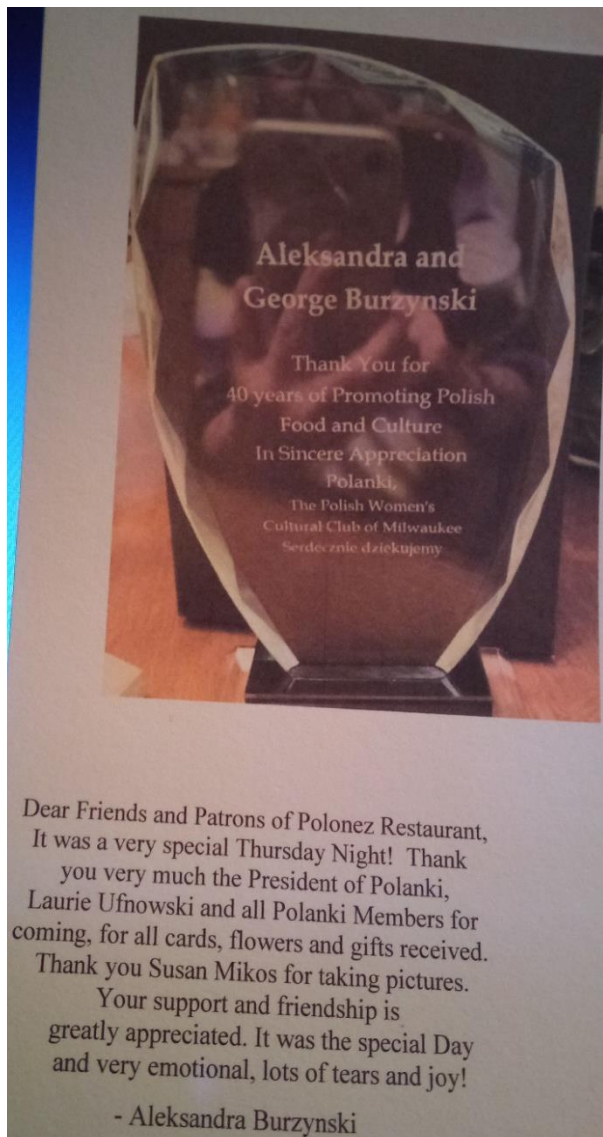

Ewa Barczyk-Pease Honored as Polish American of the Year

On Sunday October 16 the Milwaukee Society of the Polish National Alliance is honoring Ewa Barczyk-Pease as the Polish American of the Year. The Annual Pulaski Day Banquet will be held at the Polish Center of Wisconsin. A long-time active Polanki member, Ewa has served in multiple positions on the Polanki Board, including several terms as President, and currently is the First Vice President, responsible for organizing speakers and programs at Polanki membership meetings. She also has organized and developed exhibits at the Cultural Village at Polish Fest and at the International Folk Fair for many years. In addition to her many accomplishments in Polanki and other Polish organizations, Ewa is active in the Polish American Historical Association and has recently completed a book about Polish American historical sites.

The Polish American Historical Association (PAHA) issued the following announcement about Ewa's new book. "PAHA's guide to Polish American historical sites in North America is coming in October, a Polish Heritage Month! *Footprints of Polonia*, edited by Ewa Barczyk, is a unique publication, which catalogues the available information about the most important historical sites connected to the history of Polonia in the Western Hemisphere, and at the same time provides interesting and entertaining stories of places and people worth remembering. The guide is filled with color illustrations, and includes informative prologues by Stanislaus A. Blejwas and Anna D. Jaroszynska-Kirchmann.

"PAHA is proud that this publication came about with the support and collaboration from many individuals and organizations active in local Polonia. Editor Ewa Barczyk managed to create a network of field editors, who provided relevant information and pictures, checked existing sites, and contributed new angles. Hopefully, *Footprints* will find its way to all Polish homes, Polish schools and libraries, and Polonia organizations. We need to not only know our history, but also promote it and protect its physical sites.

Congratulations to Ewa Barczyk on a tremendous job well-done! We are all looking forward to holding this handsome book in our hands soon."
