

## Polanki and Laski: A Beautiful Partnership

For many years, Polanki's Christmas party raffle, along with donations from individuals throughout the year, a Polish rummage sale at the September meeting and Coins for Laski at all of the meetings, have added up to a very generous donation to Laski through Polanki. The beginnings of this "heart project" between Polanki and Laski were recounted by long-time Polanki members Heddy Moskaluk and Angela Pienkos.

The most significant person in this association between Polanki and Laski was Harriet Gostomski, Heddy's aunt and one of Polanki's founding members. Mrs. Gostomski's name is proudly etched in a brick in the Laski chapel honoring her support to Laski. On personal visits to Poland she would take private donations from Polanki members to the religious sisters at Laski to support the school's mission of educating children with visual impairments. On group tours to Poland she also introduced Laski to other travelers on the tour.

In the early days of Laski, due to the economic hardships in Poland, there was a great need for basics of daily living. Around 1980 Polanki members started to donate warm winter knitwear that was shipped to Laski to be distributed to students for Christmas. Heddy Moskaluk, with the same generous heart as her aunt, would ship and pay for the knitted items to be sent to Poland. As material goods became more readily available in Poland and shipping expenses skyrocketed, Polanki's donations became monetary rather than goods. Heddy Moskaluk, until her retirement from Polamer, also took upon herself to pay the exchange fees for this process. In gratitude for all of the Polanki members' generosity there is a plaque honoring Polanki for their generosity to Laski. It can be found attached to the outside of a building on the Laski campus.

Laski today is a thriving community that provides education from early childhood through secondary school to more than 300 students from ages 4 to 24, while teaching academic and practical subjects that will lead to future employment or higher education. Sites now include the Róża Czacka School and Educational Centre for Blind Children in Laski near Warsaw, the St. Teresa Special School and Educational Centre for Blind and Visually Impaired Children in Rabka, and the Centre for Early Support for the Development of Blind and Visually Impaired Children in Gdańsk-Sobieszewo. Laski also operates two institutions in Ukraine, which have been profoundly affected by the ongoing invasion from Russia.

Students live on Laski premises, with a variety of modern classrooms and other buildings that include a printing press, a music studio, workshops, swimming pools and a wide array of outdoor amenities. Since the invasion of Ukraine by Russia, Laski in Poland has opened its doors and arms to dozens of Ukrainian mothers and their blind children who were forced to flee from Ukraine.



Thank you to all Polanki members for your past contributions and your continuing generosity to Laski and the children they serve. This year's raffle at the Christmas party will especially benefit both Polish and Ukrainian children.

## Robert Thompson, Polanki, and Panufnik's Bassoon Concerto

Robert Thompson, a retired UWM professor of music and a distinguished bassoonist, was the guest speaker at Polanki's November membership meeting. In 1985, with Polanki's support, Professor Thompson commissioned a Bassoon Concerto from the prominent Polish composer, Andrzej Panufnik, a political exile then living in London. Panufnik dedicated the Concerto to the recently martyred Polish Solidarity priest, Jerzy Popiełuszko. Panufnik personally conducted its premiere performance with the Milwaukee Chamber Orchestra on May 18, 1986 in Vogel Hall. Polanki hosted an elegant Polish reception at UWM's Golda Meir Library.

The Bassoon Concerto has since been recorded and performed internationally. It is recognized as an outstanding chamber music composition, as well as a poignant tribute to Father Popieluszko and the cause of Polish freedom.

A recent scholarly book by Andrea F. Bohlman, entitled *Musical Solidarities: Political Action and Music in Late Twentieth-Century Poland*, published by Oxford University Press in 2020, devotes eight pages to Panufnik's Bassoon Concerto and mentions Polanki's important contribution: "... a Milwaukee-based Polish-American society, 'Polanki,' underwrote the commission and supported its world premiere, in Wisconsin, and its Polish premiere, at St. Stanisław Kostka" [Popiełuszko's Warsaw parish], which took place in 1987 (p. 190).

Of all Polanki's many cultural projects, our underwriting of Panufnik's Bassoon Concerto has perhaps had the widest reach. Since only a handful of today's Polanki remember that historic event, it was especially meaningful to learn about it from Professor Thompson himself and to listen with him to a recording of his performance with the BBC Symphony Orchestra.
